
# CHANGE THE FOLLOWING PARTS TO USE THE G-CARRIAGE ON KH-860/881

You can use the G-Carriage on the model KH-860/KH-881 (KG-88) and KH-891 (KG-89). If you use KH-860 (881) the following attachments are necessary. So put them onto your machine. (You don't need any attachments in using KH-891.)


### (1) YARN TENSION-G (Attachment for using KH-860/881)








### (1) ROW COUNTER

Set the number of rows you want to knit.

The number decreases as the G-carriage moves until it stops. (When it stop, the Row Counter shows 000.)

- \* When the Row Counter shows 000, the G-carriage does not work.
- \* If you do not use the Row Counter, set it at a large number. (ex. 900)









### (5) SELF TURNING LEVER



For turning the G-carriage automatically. It turns on either side of the knitting swatch by itself until the Row Counter shows 000.






- \*This lever is connected with the Row Counter. The number shown on it decreases as the lever turns.



# CLEANING AND OILING IS THE KEY TO KEEP THE G-CARRIAGE IN A GOOD CONDITION AND TO KNIT SMOOTHLY.

- \* Take the G-Carriage off the needlebed and clean any dust and lints with a soft cloth.
- \* Wipe the metal parts with an oiled cloth.
- \* Wipe the rear rail (and the Racks) of the knitting machine, too.
- \* Wipe the plastic parts with a soft cloth using a neutral detergent solution.
- \* Do not use alcohol, benzin, thinner nor gasoline.
- \* Do not oil the machine directly.

# TAKE CARE FOR THE GATE PEGS AND NEEDLES OF YOUR KNITTING MACHINE THEY ARE IMPORTANT KEYS FOR BETTER KNITTING, TOO



Refer to the Instruction Manual of your knitting machine and change the damaged needle to new ones.

#### **PRECAUTIONS**

- \* You don't have to worry about the heat of the Adaptor when using it for a long time.

  But do not put anything on the Adaptor that stands in the way of giving off of the heat.
- \* Do not leave it in a location nere heat sources or in a place used in direct sunlight.
- \* See that your child dose not touch the G-Carriage while you are away from the machine.
- \* Do not move or pull the knitting by force while it is working. It might cause something wrong.
