Remarks relating to the FORM COMPUTER

While knitting with the FORM COMPUTER, have you ever noticed or even used the programme for "straight knitted neckband" ?

You may not be aware that this programme can, in fact, be used for many other knitted parts rather than just neckbands. Any rectangular piece, be it a shawl, stole, straight knitted back or front part of a sweater or parts of a baby jumper can be knitted with this programme.

If you want to use this programme for a tubular, straight skirt, then you enter at the place marked "cm neck opening" the measurements for half the width of the skirt, and at the place marked "cm height of band" the desired length of the skirt.






But this programme can be used for even more things : you can also follow it for trapeze-shaped pieces of knitting. Contrary to the advice on page 3, it is quite possible to enter different measurements at the two places provided for "cm neck opening". At the first 'dot' you enter the measurement that your piece of knitting is going to have when you cast on, at the second 'dot' you enter the measurement the piece is going to have when you cast off.

For a slightly flared skirt, you therefore enter at the first 'dot' of "cm neck opening" e.g. 68 cm and at the second 'dot' 40 cm.

Of course, you can also programme knitted pieces that are narrower at the bottom than at the top, like e.g. sleeves without a shaped sleeve head but straight across the top.

One more small tip : the computer automatically displays the last increase or decrease in the very last row before casting off, so it is best to adjust the measurement at the top accordingly.

Please note the new abbreviations for the pattern descriptions







- 2 R Knit 2 rows
- 4 R Knit 4 rows
- 1  Racking handle one full turn to the right
- 2  Racking handle two full turns to the right
- 1  Racking handle one full turn to the left
-  Transfer stitches from back to front
-  Transfer stitches from front to back

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.


If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Abbreviations:

-  = tubular (or) = half tubular
-  = every (in every row)
-  = times
-  = increase
-  = decrease, cast off
-  = graduations (short rows)

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular  respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+ 3 \times 2 \cdot 8 \cdot R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $- 19 \times 3 \cdot 7 \cdot R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $- 17 \times 1 \cdot 2 / 3 \cdot R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle - 4 \times 8 \cdot 2 \cdot R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20 \text{ cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43 \text{ cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

IF YOU KNIT WITH THE FORM COMPUTER

Enter the measurements of your test square as follows :

- A Enter here the measurement in mm of 40 rows of your test square
- B Enter here the measurement in mm of 40 sts of your test square
- C Enter here the measurement in mm of 40 rows of the band. Note : It is possible for 'C' to appear twice in a programme, in which case the same measurement has to be entered twice.

Flashing figures :

For the flashing figures 1 to 5 you will no longer find separate explanations in the descriptions. What has to be done when these flashing figures appear, you have to look up in the general explanations which you should in any case study carefully before you start to knit.

The general meaning of the flashing figures is as follows :

- 1 Cast-on over the indicated number of needles on the front bed.
- 2 Transfer from band to pattern.
- 3 Divide work into two equal halves for neck opening.
- 4 End of first shoulder, to knit second shoulder press key GO.
- 5 End of knitting.

For many garments you will find for the neck or armhole band, or even front bands for a jacket, the remark :

"Use the programme for straight knitted band", which is the following programme :

Important : In both places where it says "width of band or neck opening", always enter the same measurement in both places.

Width of band or neck opening always means the width you obtain from the stitches you have cast on.

Height of band always means the measurement you obtain from the rows you have knitted.

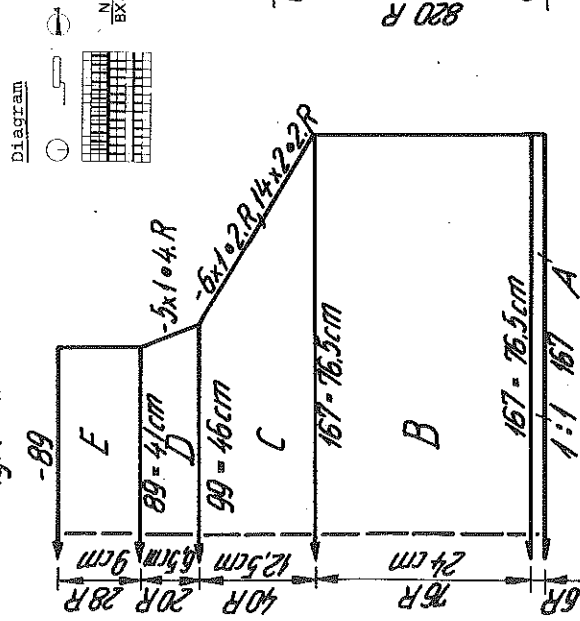
- Size :** Bust 88 to 94 cm, hips 94 to 98 cm
Material : 400 g fairly fine synthetic yarn with a silky look, green. 100 g (5 balls) fairly fine Lurex, silver, 4 buttons.
Stitch size: Fairisle back 3, front 2 3/4, 1:1 rib = 3 3/4
Test square: (Only the stitches on back bed are counted)
Bodice (pressed width-wise) : 50 sts = 23 cm, 50 R = 15,5 cm
Skirt (pressed length-wise) : 50 sts = 32 cm, 50 R = 13 cm
Pattern : Fairisle acc. to diagram with deco punchcard no. 74atb
 Bands in 1:1 (Lurex)

Fig. VII + VIII : Skirt. Knitted sideways. Begin at side seam. Using contrast yarn, cast on 150 sts on back bed, knit a few rows. Then, bring 149 nds into WP at front, knit fairisle acc. to diagram as follows : Position the 1st positioning pin at the right 2 nds in from the right knitting edge, the 2nd positioning pin onto the 4th nd at left of centre, the 3rd positioning pin onto the 64th nd at left of centre. Align card reader centre with the 23rd nd at left of centre. Knit 820 rows, then release the sts of front bed, knit a few rows contrast yarn on back bed, release sts. Completely unravel sts at front.

Fig. I : Back. Fairisle acc. to diagram but without deco card.
A = Lurex, tubular cast on for 1:1 rib. B = transfer sts to back bed, knit in pattern acc. to diagram. C = cast off sts on back bed very loosely and at front release 1 st for every cast off st. D = dec. at each end. E = knit straight. End by releasing all sts at front, and casting off loosely at back.

Flashing figures :

6 When flashing figure 6 appears for the first time, place the indicated number of stitches (starting from the left) onto deckercomb. When flashing fig. 6 appears for the second time, place the stitches you have been knitting with onto deckercomb, and, starting from the left on the knitting, place the indicated number of sts onto nds of machine. Cast off the remaining centre sts by hand.

7 At right, adjacent to the sts on the machine, place as many sts of an old test square onto the nds of the machine, as the number of sts you have previously cast off. Adjacent to these sts place the sts at right back onto nds of machine. Cont. to knit with all sts.

at left of centre 91 nds) tubular cast on for 1:1 rib. B = transfer all sts to back bed. Then knit interrupted pattern acc. to diagram and with deco card (i.e. one pattern width) as follows :
 1st positioning pin at right of centre on needle 78
 2nd " " at left " " " " 7

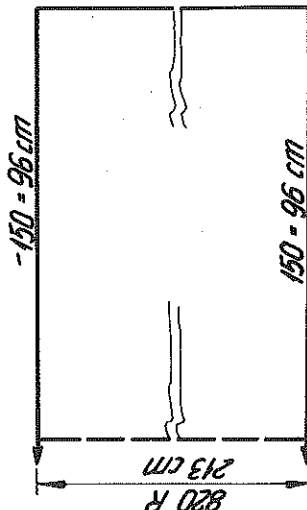

To make up : Unravel front sts on all parts. Pin out skirt to required length and press. Then crochet together beginning and end, unravelling contrast yarn. Block and press bodice. Crochet together side and sleeve seams. Backstitch, st by st, sleeve bands to sleeve edges, unravelling contrast yarn. Gather top of skirt (on a length of yarn) and crochet on inside to bodice (remove gathering yarn again). Join back and front on the shoulder with 2 buttons on each side. At waist level insert shirring elastic. Wear this dress with a decorative belt.

- 103 yds per 1 oz
- 800 m length per 100 g for Lurex
- 251 yds per 1 oz

To make up : Block parts and leave to dry under damp cloth. Join sleeve seams, matching *. Sew bands in position along sleeve edge with "long stitch" to the outside, attach on inside. Set in sleeves, matching o and arrows. Join side seams. Sew band in position in the same way as on the sleeve edges. Sew on buttons.

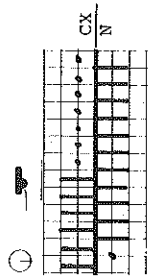
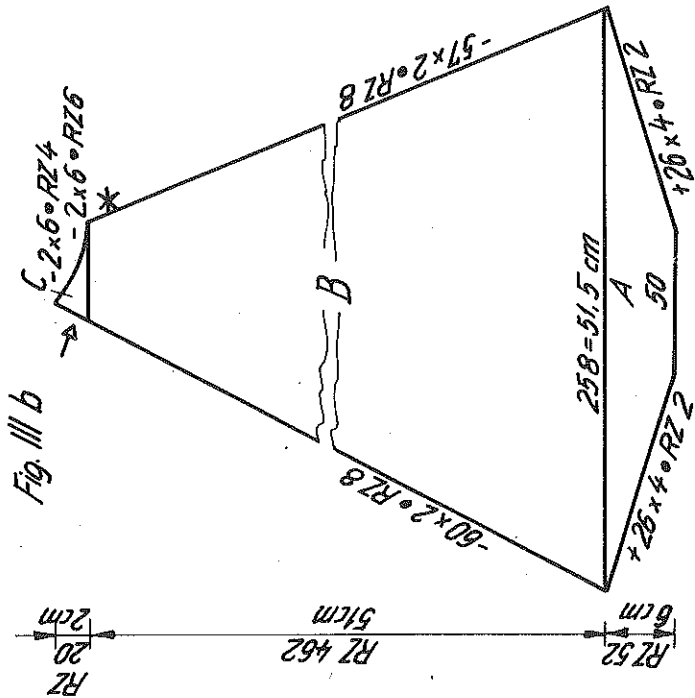
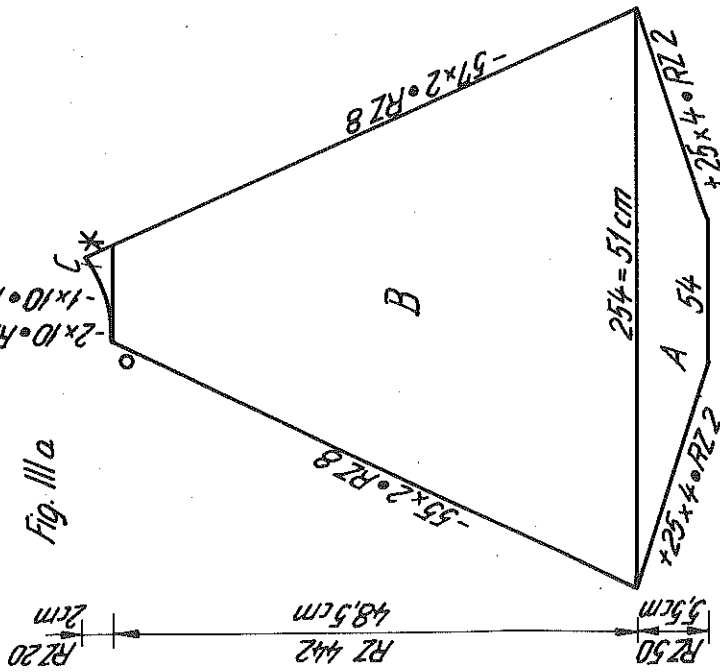
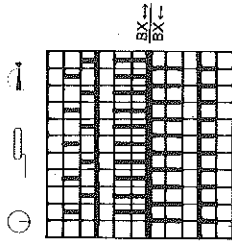


Diagram for pattern

Armhole band : Knit two. Tubular cast on for 2:2 rib with 196 sts over a width of 147 nds. Knit 16 rows straight. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release. Pocket band : Knit two. As above, but with 48 sts over a width of 36 nds, 18 rows.

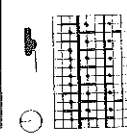
To make up : Block and press parts. Join shoulders. Join the two parts of front bands with mattress stitch. Sew all bands to their respective edges, st by st, backstitching through the open loops and unravelling contrast length of yarn. Unravel contrast yarn of pocket slits and thread loose sts onto a yarn. Attach pocket bands, st by st, backstitching through the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn, sew on pocket side edges. Join side seams. Sew on buttons.

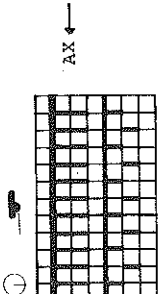

Diagram 1: For front and back parts

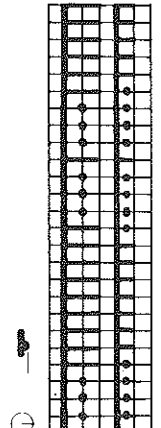

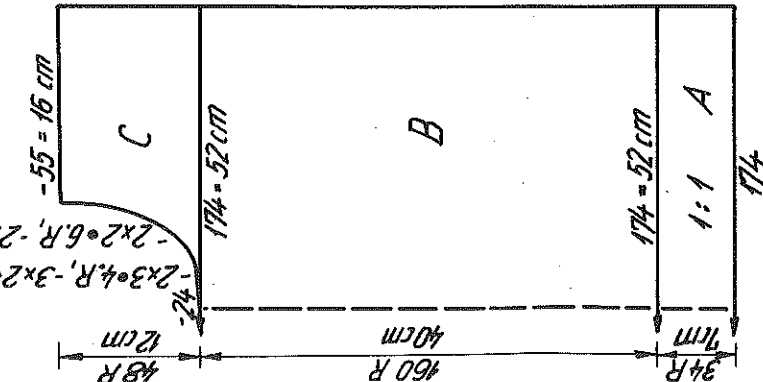

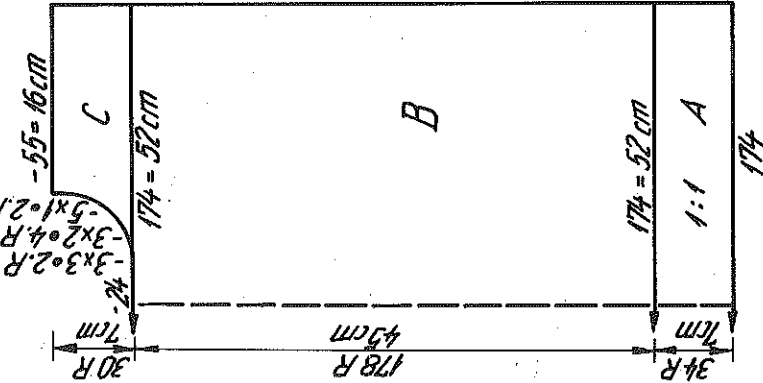

8 Transfer for stocking stitch, knit 10 R orange

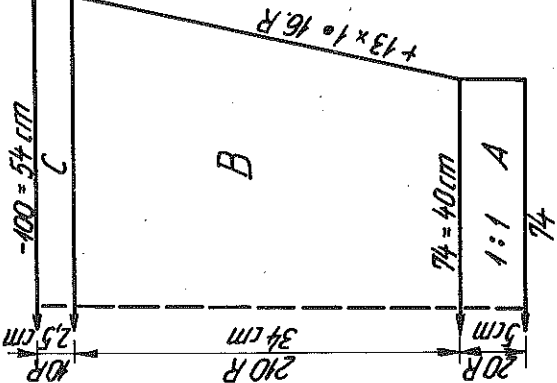

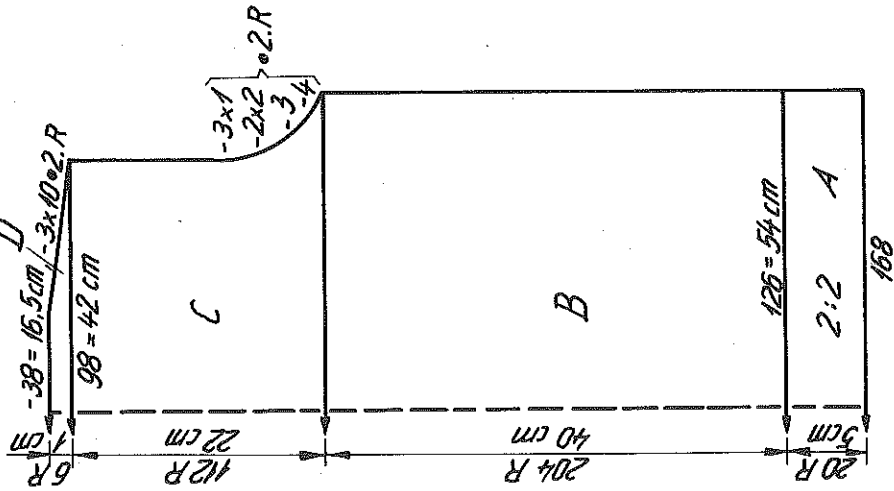

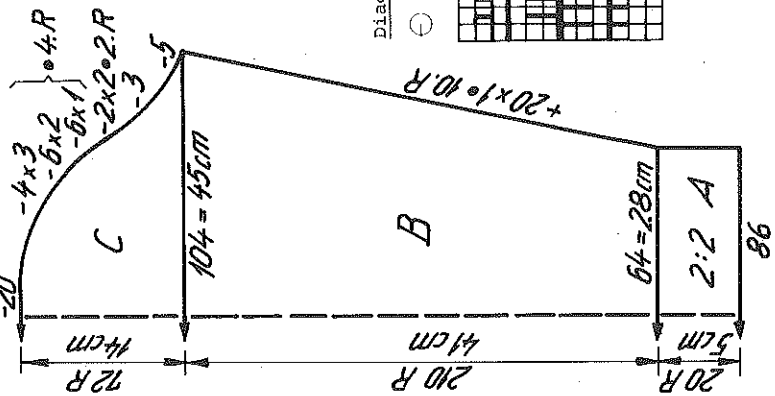
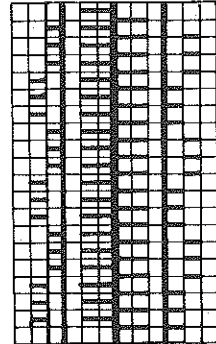


Diagram for pattern with U70/U80

Pocket lining : Light blue, closed cast on with 60 sts on each bed, Knit RC 90 tubular. End with a few rows contrast yarn, release.
To make up : Block and press parts lightly. Sew pocket lining, st by st, backstitching through the open loops, to pocket slit, unravel contrast yarn. Then sew pocket band in the same way to slit edge, attach at each end. Join shoulder seams. Join side and sleeve seams. With right sides facing, set in sleeves. Sew on buttons. Attach collar.

Note : For the collar, 40 sts must result in at least 186 mm.
Note : The Form Computer Programme contains no indications on where to position pockets.

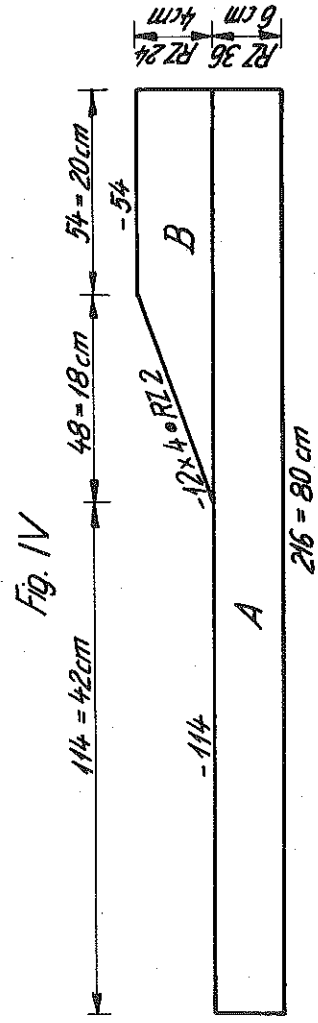

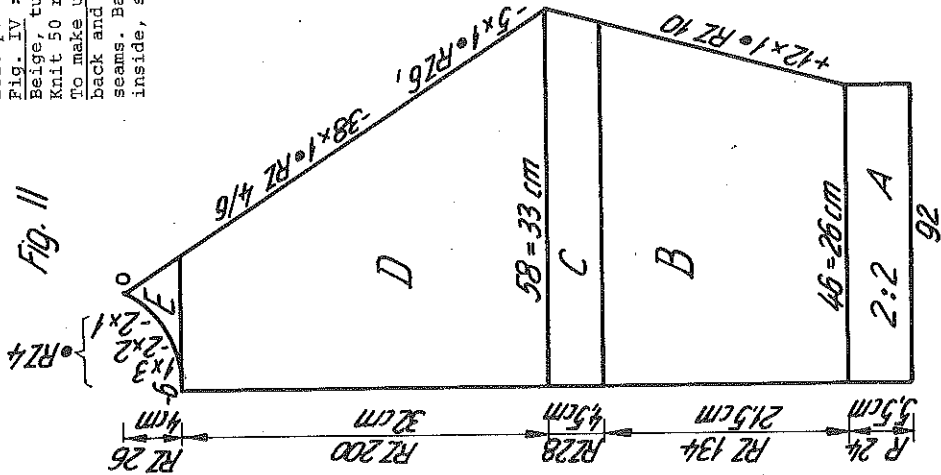
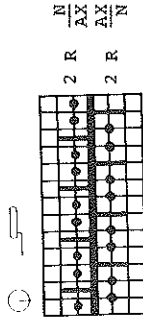


Diagram for pattern

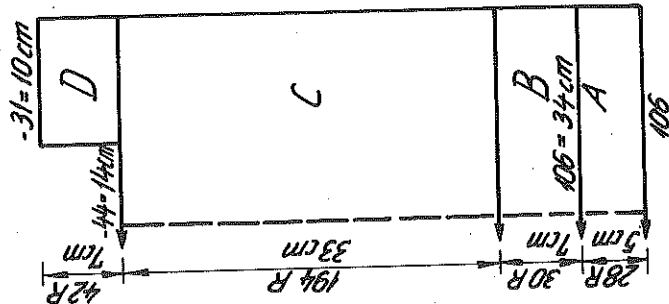

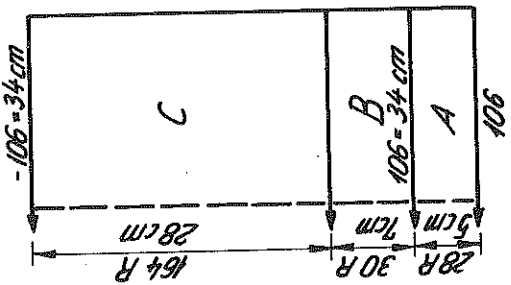

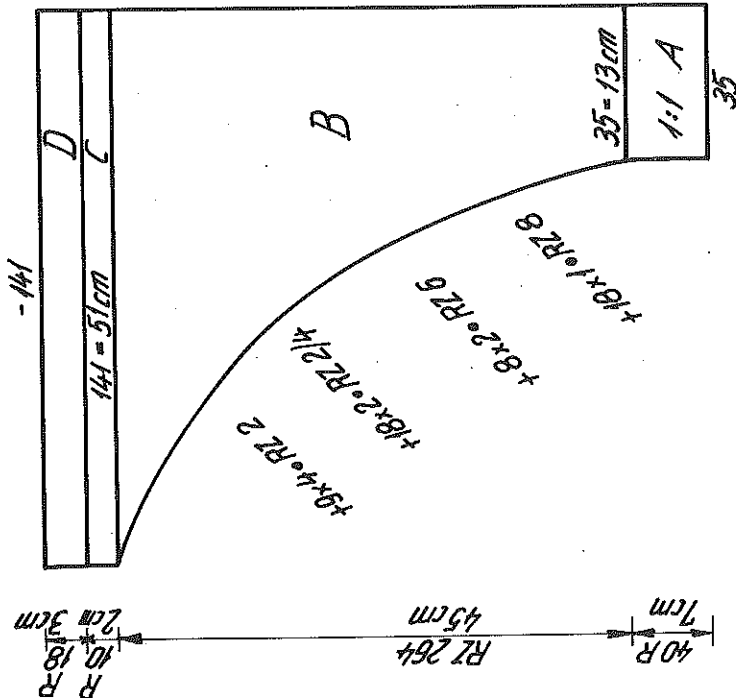
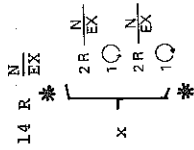
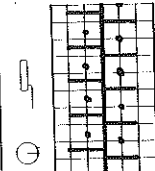


Diagram for pattern

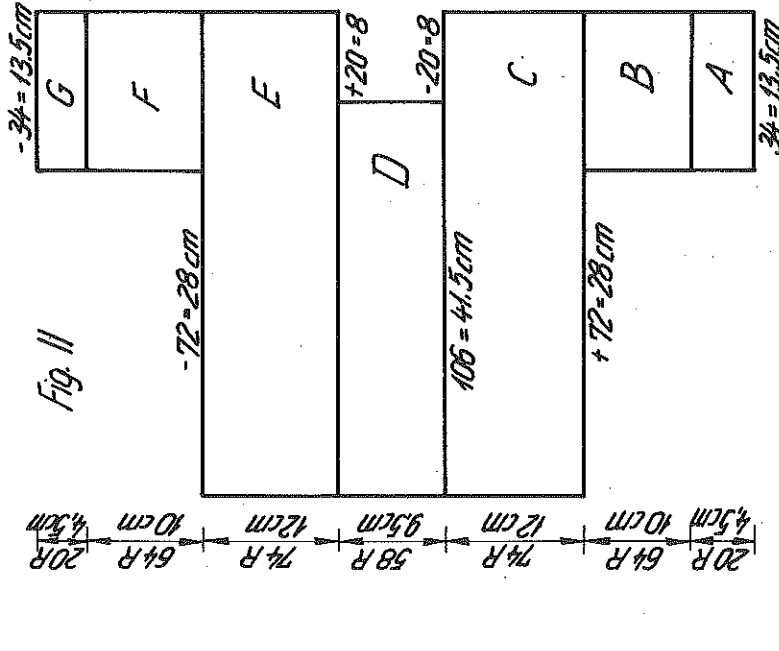
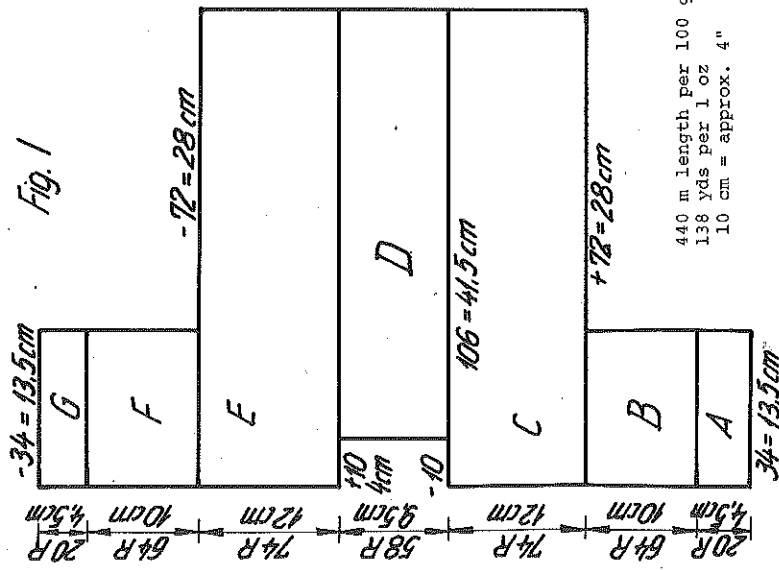
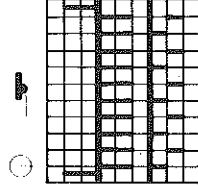


Diagram for pattern without deco

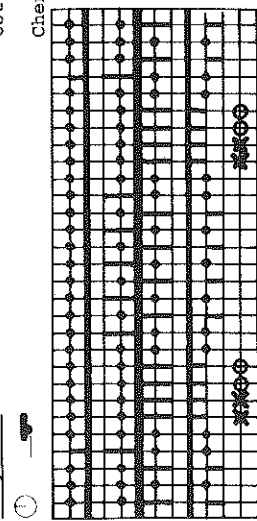

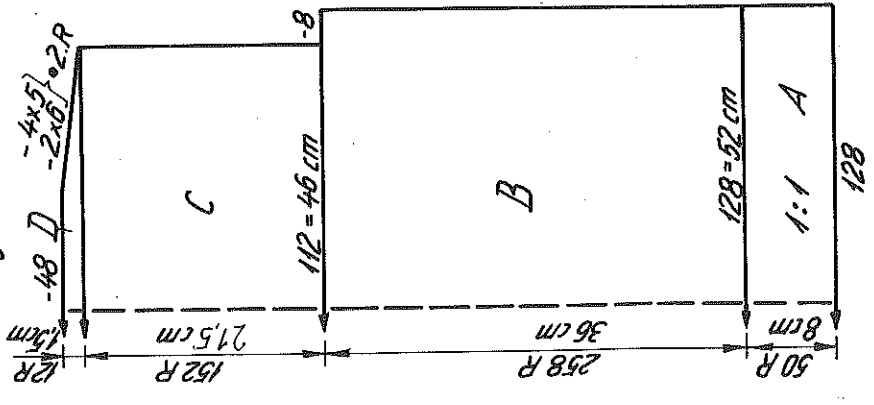

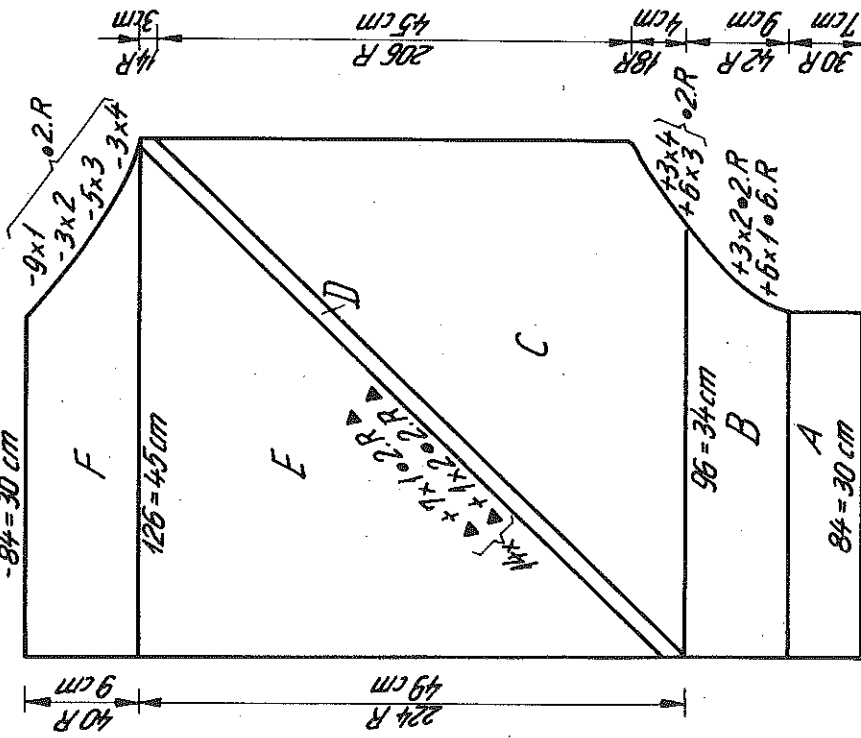

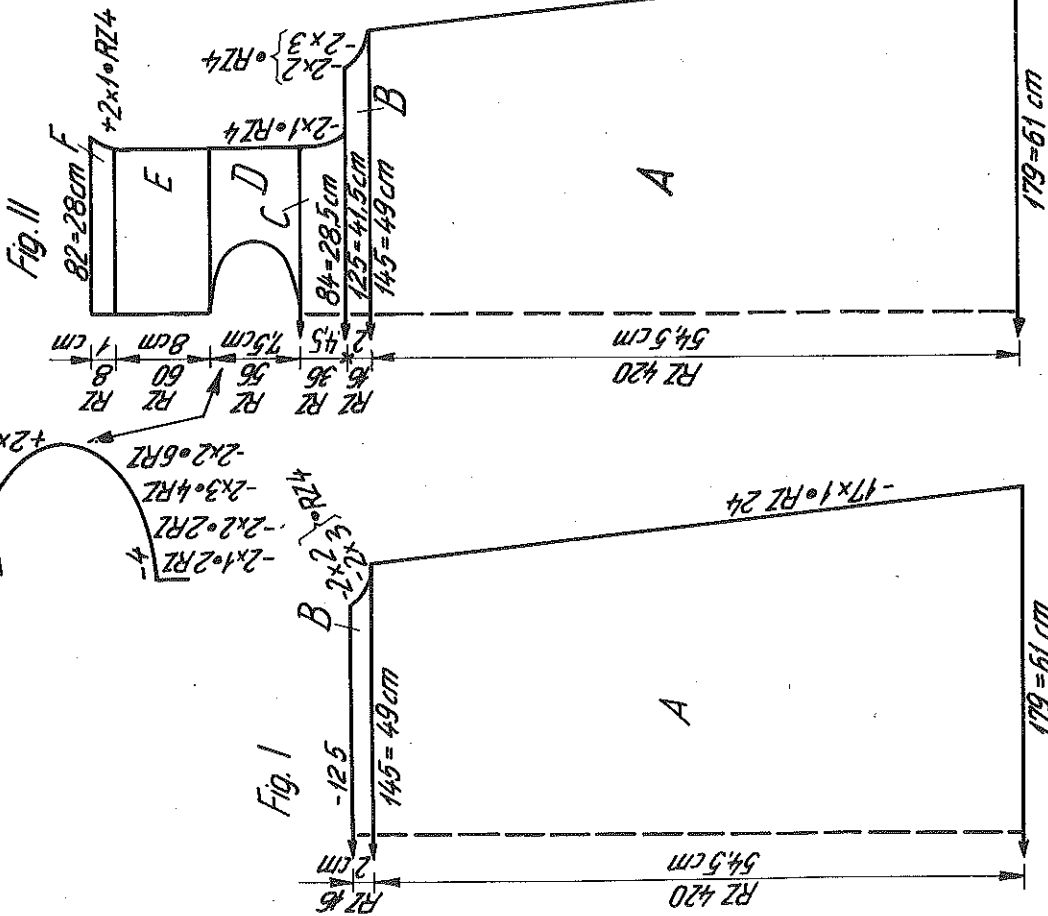

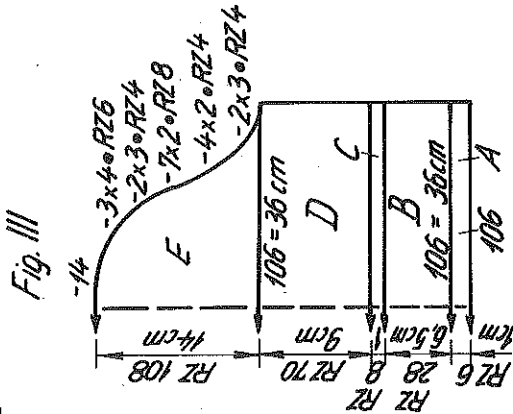
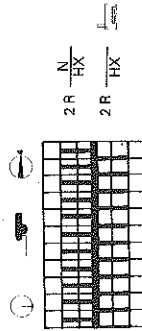


Diagram for pattern

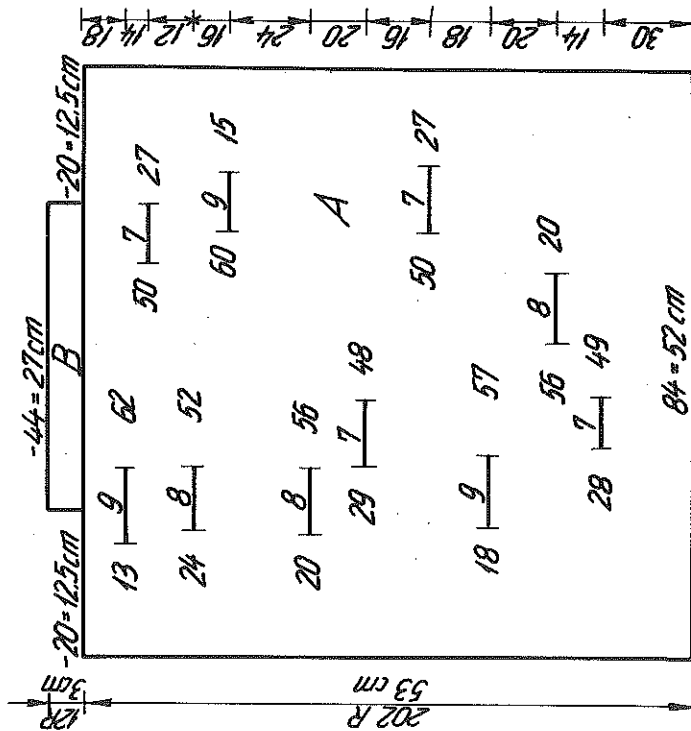


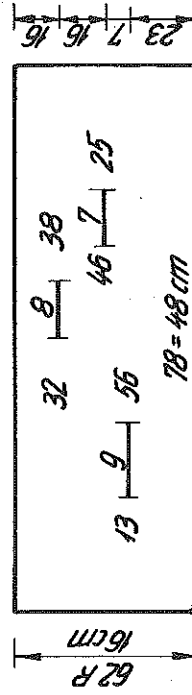

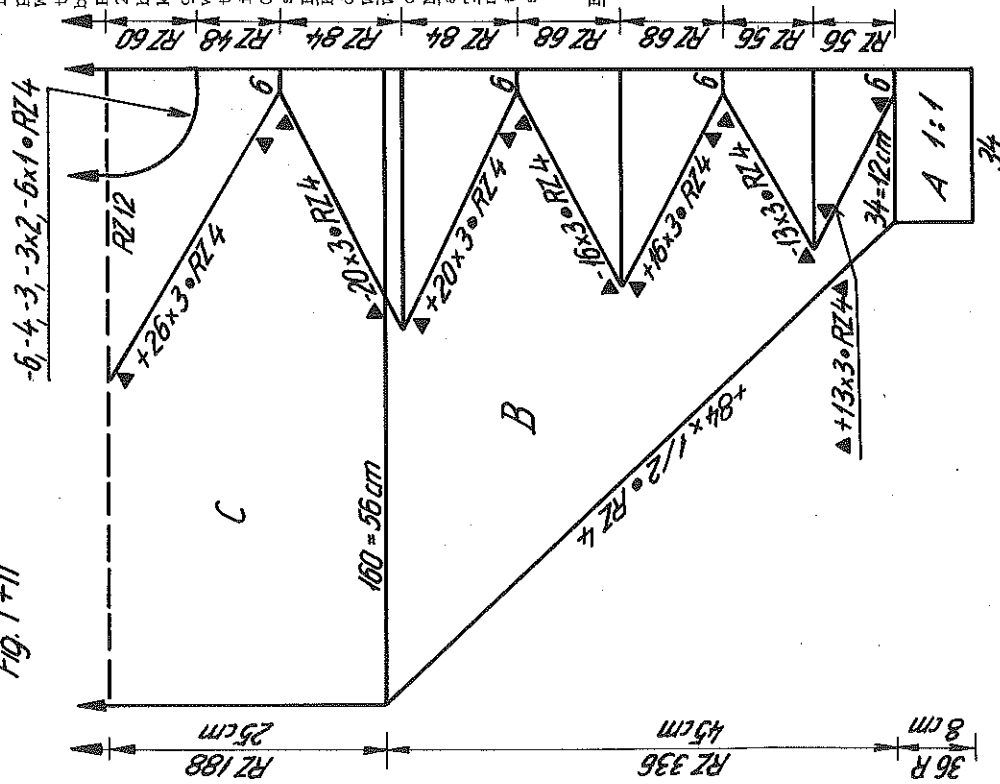

Knit as for back but reading light brown for dark brown. At section C, at right dec. and inc. for neck acc. to diagram.

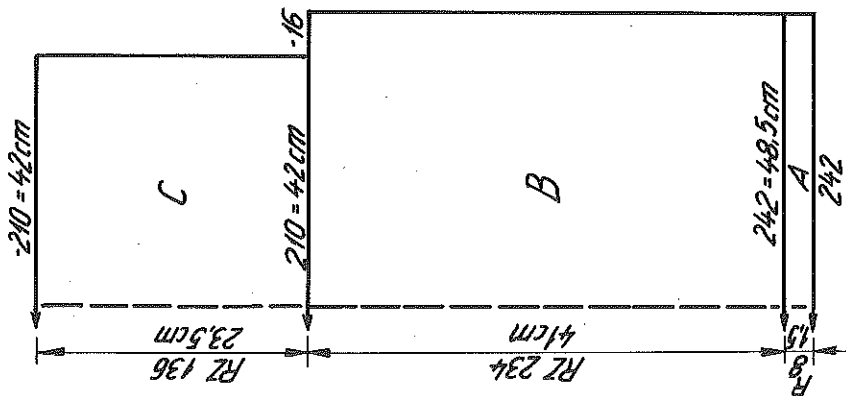

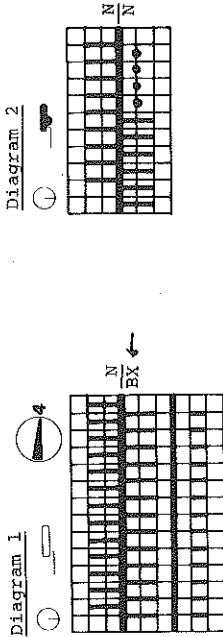

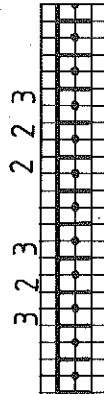
